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Reading: A conference in Istanbul

The aim of this section is to improve students' ability:

- To assess a text for its usefulness by identifying its purpose.
- For whom it has been written.

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STUDY SKILL Purpose & audience (1)

To understand the contents of a text better, predict what you can before you read by checking:

- pictures & headings
- layout, size, & style of the print
- purpose, e.g. to inform, to sell.
- audience (who it is written for), e.g. a student, an expert.

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STUDY SKILL Purpose & audience (2)

The <u>purpose</u> and the expected <u>audience</u> of a text will affect the choice of:

- Vocabulary
- grammatical style
- punctuation

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STUDY SKILL Purpose & audience (2)

When you are writing, think about:

- who is going to read your work
- why you are writing.

Then decide what the overall style should be, e.g.:

- literary
- academic
- formal
- informal, etc.

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The aim of this section is to:

Writing: Invitations

- differentiate between formal & informal writing.
- choose the appropriate style for the written work.

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STUDY SKILL Using formal expressions

- Formal style is used for academic & professional purposes.
- Thus, you need to learn fixed formal expressions, e.g.:

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I have great pleasure in + -ing
I am writing + infinitive
I would like + infinitive
Please feel free + infinitive
I look forward to + -ing
Please find attached/enclosed + noun
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N.B. infinitive = to + verb, e.g. to play, to work, to study, etc.

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Vocabulary development: Word-building (2)

The aim of this section is to:

 Understand the effect of adding prefixes & suffixes to a root word, e.g.:

Prefix: write, rewrite
Suffix: act (v), actor (n)

• Expand understanding of vocabulary.

STUDY SKILL Suffixes

Identify the part of speech of a word (verb, noun, adjective, or adverb) to:

- · help you understand the meaning
- develop your vocabulary, e.g.:

inform (v), information (n), informal (adj), informally (adv)

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STUDY SKILL Suffixes

Suffixes give you clues to the part of speech, e.g.:

- noun suffixes:
- -tion, -ism, -ment, -ity, -ness
 Invite (v), invitation (n)
- adjective suffixes:
- -al, -ful, -able international
- adverb suffix:

-ly

formal (adj), formally (adv)

STUDY SKILL Prefixes

- Adding a prefix changes the meaning of a word.
- Each prefix has a different meaning, e.g.:

mis- means *wrong* or *not* e.g. *misunderstand*.

bi- means two or twice, e.g. biannual (twice a year).

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
